

# FEES AND CHARGES FOR 2010



## Domestic Students

Domestic students are those students who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or holders of a permanent visa. Depending upon the course in which enrolment is sought, Christian Heritage College can offer to domestic students either a fee-paying place, or a Commonwealth supported place. Currently, only students who are in preservice teacher education courses are eligible for a Commonwealth supported place.

Fee-paying students incur a tuition fee. Students who meet the residency eligibility requirements may choose to defer the payment of their tuition fee through FEE-HELP. Students who do not meet the residency eligibility requirements or who do not wish to defer their tuition fees through FEE-HELP must pay their tuition fee in full upfront.

Commonwealth supported students incur a student contribution amount. Students who meet the residency eligibility requirements may choose to defer the payment of their student contribution amount through HECS-HELP. Students who do not meet the residency eligibility requirements or who do not wish to defer their student contribution amount through HECS-HELP must pay their student contribution amount upfront. Subject to residency eligibility requirements, students who make upfront payments of \$500 or more, or the total student contribution amount, attract a 20% discount.

This document provides information to enable current and prospective students to calculate the cost of study in a unit or a course of study.

## Fee-paying Students:

### Tuition Fees for 2010

Standard units at Christian Heritage College carry a 10 credit point value.

## Commonwealth Supported Students:

### Student contribution amounts for 2010

The Commonwealth Government sets a minimum price for student contribution amounts and institutions are able to set their rates within certain ranges. The student contribution amount varies depending upon the discipline category of the courses studied, and the year in which a student enrolled in a course of study. Courses are grouped into seven funding clusters. Christian Heritage College offers courses in three of these clusters, which are shown in the table below. These amounts correlate to 1 EFTSL of study. For further information regarding EFTSLs, please consult the *EFTSL Values For Units of Study for 2010* information sheet.

Subject to residency eligibility requirements, students who make upfront payments of \$500 or more, or the total student contribution amount, attract a 20% discount.

## Other Fees and Charges:

All domestic students will incur a fee for the following:

- Transcript - \$15

*Students are provided with a transcript upon their graduation from a CHC course. Students who require a transcript prior to graduation or who request a replacement transcript will be required to pay a fee. Transcript requests must be made using the 'Request for Transcript' form which is available on the CHC website or from the CHC Reception, and submitted to the CHC Reception at which time payment is to be made. Please allow five working days for the preparation of the transcript.*

- Additional Assignment Folders - \$0.30 each

*Students are issued with a sufficient number of assignment folders at the beginning of each unit. The above charge is for extra folders, which may be purchased from the CHC Reception. Alternatively, the front page of the assignment folder may be downloaded from the CHC website.*

- Library Fines for overdue resources:
  - General loans: 20c per resource per day
  - Closed reserve: 30c per day per resource
  - Library use only: 30c per resource per hour

- Replacement of the following - \$15 each
  - Student ID card
  - Book of Readings
  - Study Guide
  - Style Guide
  - Student Handbook

*Students are issued with these items at the beginning of each year or semester (as applicable). If replacement or extra items are required by students, the fee will apply (per item).*

- Miscellaneous costs:

Some courses may involve miscellaneous costs which are to be met by students. Most are associated with Elective units and will be incurred only if students choose to enrol in those units. However, some costs are associated with activities which are part of a core unit.

The following information regarding miscellaneous costs is given in terms of the CHC Schools which offer the units in which these costs may arise.

#### School of Christian Studies

A number of elective units offered by the School of Christian Studies require students to engage with others at a community, organisational or individual level. Travel costs may be incurred by students in the fulfilment of this requirement.

Students who enrol in the unit *CS253 Cross Cultural Experience* undertake an overseas trip to become immersed in another culture. Students are required to fund all costs associated with this unit, such as visas, airfares, travel insurance, vaccinations, etc.

Students who enrol in the unit *CS261 Spiritual Formation* undertake a live-in spiritual retreat and spiritual direction. Students are required to fund all costs associated with this unit, such as travel, accommodation, etc.

#### School of Education and Humanities

##### *STEP/PACE Activities*

Students undertake Student Teacher Embedded Practice (STEP) and Professional and Community Experiences (PACE) activities in the course of their preservice teacher education courses.

PACE is part of the Professional Experience Program (PEP) and is not attached to any particular units. The completion of these activities may involve transport, accommodation and other living costs.

### *Professional Experience Program (PEP)*

Students complete the following units as part of the Professional Experience Program (PEP):

- SP200 School-based Professional Experiences I
- SP301 School-based Professional Experiences II
- SP302 School-based Professional Experiences III
- SP403 School-based Professional Experiences IV
- SP404 School-based Internship Program

Students in the Bachelor of Education (Secondary/Middle Years - Graduate Entry) complete the following units as part of the Professional Experience Program (PEP):

- SP231 School-based Professional Experiences GE I
- SP332 School-based Professional Experiences GE II
- SP433 School-based Professional Experiences GE III

All students are required to complete at least one 'away' PEP experience. This may require costs relating to travel, accommodation and other living expenses. Eligible students have access to additional income support through Centrelink when engaging in an 'away' PEP unit.

#### *Other costs*

Students who enrol in the elective unit *SC205 Environmental Science Studies* undertake an overnight excursion to an environmental camp. This involves payment for accommodation, food and transport.

Students who enrol in any of the Drama units offered by the School of Education and Humanities may be required to attend live performances, view films, etc. Such activities may include transport, entry fee and other costs.

It is a requirement of all preservice courses offered by the School of Education and Humanities that students possess a Senior First Aid course with appropriate certification (eg St John, Red Cross, QAS) and Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) accreditation and an accredited swimming/lifesaving award (eg at least the Royal Life Saving Society's Swim and Survive Level 5 or equivalent). All costs associated with fulfilling this requirement are to be met by students.

### School of Social Sciences

Students who enrol in the Bachelor of Social Science (Counselling) (SS12), Graduate Diploma in Counselling Studies (SS42) and Master of Counselling (SS51) must fulfil a required number of hours of observations which includes obtaining their own counselling. Costs may be incurred in the fulfilment of this requirement which are to be met by the student; however, students may avail themselves of the free student counselling service offered by CHC. Counselling students are also required to engage in a minimum number of supervision sessions. These sessions are subsidised by CHC; however, students may be required to contribute to these costs.

A number of elective units offered by the School of Social Sciences require students to engage with others at a community, organisational or individual level. Travel costs may be incurred by students in the fulfilment of this requirement.

Students who enrol in the unit *CD253 Cross Cultural Experience* undertake an overseas trip to become immersed in another culture. Students are required to fund all costs associated with this unit, such as visas, airfares, travel insurance, vaccinations, etc.

## Overseas Students

Overseas students are students who do not meet the classification of domestic students and are in Australia on a temporary visa. This includes student visas as well as other types of temporary visas, such as business visas and spousal visas.

All overseas students will incur a fee for the following:

- Application for Admission - \$200
- Transfer of Credit Application Fee - \$50
- Credit Transfer Fee - \$5 per credit point
- Withdrawal Fee - \$500

*Overseas students who withdraw from their course on a date between the end of a semester and on or before the Census Date of the following semester will incur a Withdrawal fee. Please note that Overseas students who withdraw from their course on a date after the Census Date of a semester do not incur a Withdrawal Fee but are liable for their full Tuition Fees for that semester.*
