| Rationale | <p><u>Enduring Understanding:</u> Effective preparation and planning provides a solid foundation for engaging teaching and learning.</p> <p>This unit is the first of four units for primary years pre-service teachers (P-6) to provide professional and practical experiences, supported by participation in a four week school placement. Pre-service teachers will be given the opportunity to develop core practices required for developmentally appropriate teaching and learning of students. This unit focuses on the specific requirements of planning, implementing and reflecting on teaching and learning including for primary years contexts (P-6). They will explore developing learning experiences grounded in relevant curriculum documentation, current pedagogical practice and Christian worldview perspectives unique to the learning needs of Prep-Year 2 and Year 3-6.</p> <p>Opportunity for pre-service teachers to integrate theory and practice is provided as part of the unit in the context of a school-based professional experience block of four weeks within a primary phase (P-6) classroom context. The planning concepts and processes addressed in this unit will form the basis for building deeper and broader expertise across all subsequent school-based professional experiences.</p> |

| Learning outcomes | <p>On completion of this unit, pre-service teachers will have provided evidence that they have:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. planned effective lessons across a range of learning areas in the primary school context based on relevant curriculum documentation; 2. utilised a range of developmentally appropriate teaching and learning strategies and resources including ICT when planning learning experiences; 3. developing an understanding of reflective practices to guide planning for learning; 4. demonstrated a capacity to engage in reflective practice in relation to personal and professional qualities relevant to the role of a teacher; 5. evaluated the links between theory and practice and the relationship to 'teaching Christianly'; and 6. communicated at an appropriate tertiary standard: with special attention to design elements, grammars, usage, logical relations, style, referencing and presentation. |
